

HOLY SCRIPTURES

All Scripture is given by inspiration of God by which we understand the whole Bible to be inspired in the sense that holy men of God were moved by the Holy Spirit to write the very words of Scripture Divine inspiration extends equally and fully to all parts of the original writings.


The whole Bible in the original is, therefore, without error and, as such, is infallible absolutely supreme and sufficient in authority in all matters of faith and practice.

The Bible does not simply contain the Word of God, but is, in reality, the complete revelation and very Word of God inspired by the Holy Spirit.

Christian believers today receive spiritual illumination to enable them to understand the Scriptures, but God does not grant new revelations that are contrary or additional to inspired biblical truth.

O2 How Was The Bible Compiled?

HISTORY

- Creation 2000 B.C. Originally, the earliest Scriptures are handed down from generation to generation orally.
- 2000-1500 B.C. The book of Job, perhaps the oldest book of the Bible, is written.
- 1500-1400 B.C. The stone tablets of the Ten Commandments are given to Moses at Mount Sinai and later stored in the Ark of the Covenant.
- 1400–400 B.C. The manuscripts comprising the original Hebrew Bible (39 Old Testament books) are completed. The Book of the Law is kept in the tabernacle and later in the Temple beside the Ark of the Covenant.
- 300 B.C. All of the original Old Testament Hebrew books have been written, collected, and recognized as official, canonical books.
- 250–200 B.C. The Septuagint, a popular Greek translation of the Hebrew Bible (39 Old Testament books), is produced. The 14 books of the Apocrypha are also included.
- 45-100 A.D. Original 27 books of the Greek New Testament are written.
- 397 A.D. Council of Carthage 397 AD, finalized Canon, 66 books



How does knowing how the Bible was created help you understand it better?

All theological books claim to have divine inspiration and divine roots.

- Vedas Hindu philosophy passed down orally.
- Tripitaka & Sutras The teachings of Buddha.
- Quran The sacred scripture of Islam that was revealed to Mohammed, the Prophet.
- The Book of Mormon Engravings on golden plates discovered by Joseph Smith.

The Bible is different, in that God has a desire to reveal Himself to His creation, allowing His revelation to take place over thousands of years with dozens of writers. The Bible is about God's life, not ours!

Self-revelation:

"The Bible is the revelation of the character and will of God - who we are? How can we live in relationship with Him?" William D. Mounce, New Testament Greek scholar.

"The Bible is a grand narrative that brings us back into fellowship with God and brings us into harmonious fellowship with one another where we live together, reflecting His character, and ultimately, a redeemed humanity in a new heaven and a new earth." If you don't know the entire story of the Bible, you will struggle to understand pieces.

The New Testament is a fulfillment of what we understand in the Old Testament.

Such things were written in the Scriptures long ago to teach us. And the Scriptures give us hope and encouragement as we wait patiently for God's promises to be fulfilled.





• The Bible is the basis of truth for all who believe.

When we are considering how to respond to the largest debates of our day, the Bible must be our measuring stick that we use to guide our thoughts and words.

Many believers today form an opinion based on personal experience, cultural norms, or Church practises. We know words of songs, quotes from motivational speakers, but not lines of Scripture.

It is the only reliable source to understand God.

Pastors will share ideas, messages and reflections on the Bible, but their opinions are not a substitution for the Bible.

Learning from Pastors is an easy way for us to digest Scripture, but it's not enough to simly rely on Pastors to feed you Biblical truths - you should deep dive the Scriptures on your own, to understand God.
