Why 18 Studying The Bible An Important Practice For Believers!

In our churches, we often rely on others to teach us about the Bible, instead of us reading it for ourselves. There are a few reasons why daily Bible reading makes such a difference in someone's personal faith journey:

God communicates with us through the Scriptures.

All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives. It corrects us when we are wrong and teaches us to do what is right. God uses it to prepare and equip his people to do every good work. 2 Timothy 3:16–17 (NLT)

Jesus aligned his life to the teachings of Scripture.

But Jesus told him, "No! The Scriptures say, 'People do not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God." Matthew 4:4 (NLT)

First Century believers studied the Scriptures

And the people of Berea were more open-minded than those in Thessalonnica, and they listened eagerly to Paul's message. They searched the Scriptures day after day to see if Paul and Silas were teaching the truth. Acts 17:11 (NLT)

The scriptures reveal Jesus and salvation to us.

"You search the Scriptures because you think they give you eternal life. But the Scriptures point to me!" John 5:39 (NLT)

The Scriptures give us encouragement and hope.

I have written this to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, so that you may know you have eternal life. 1 John 5:13 (NLT)

The Scriptures provide correction and discipline.

For the word of God is alive and powerful. It is sharper than the sharpest two-edged sword, cutting between soul and spirit, between joint and marrow. It exposes our innermost thoughts and desires. Hebrews 4:12 (NLT)

The Scriptures provide protection, power and authority.

Therefore, put on every piece of God's armor so you will be able to resist the enemy in the time of evil. Then after the battle you will still be standing firm...Put on salvation as your helmet, and take the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. Ephesians 6:13,17 (NLT)

How can we really know Him, unless we read His Word?

I pray that from his glorious, unlimited resources he will empower you with inner strength through his Spirit. Then Christ will make his home in your hearts as you trust in him. Your roots will grow down into God's love and keep you strong. And may you have the power to understand, as all God's people should, how wide, how long, how high, and how deep his love is. May you experience the love of Christ, though it is too great to understand fully. Then you will be made complete with all the fullness of life and power that comes from God. Ephesians 3:16–19 (NLT)

Studying the Bible is not just informative, it's transformative!

Two approaches to studying the Bible:

- 1. Deductive topical studies
- 2. Inductive passage or book studies

Key steps to studying the Bible:

- **Observation** what are the main things you notice while reading the passage?
- Interpretation what did the passage mean to the original reader, and to you?
- Application how does the passage affect your life today?
- Correlation how does the passage relate to the rest of the Bible?

At PORTICO we suggest following the simple acronym S.O.A.P. for your daily devotions:

<u>Scripture</u> - what Bible verse(s) stood out to you? <u>Observation</u> - what did you learn when you reflected on the Bible verse(s)? <u>Application</u> - how can you apply the Bible verse(s) to your life today? <u>Prayer</u> = write down your prayer to God, asking Him to help you apply this truth.

Now we see things imperfectly, like puzzling reflections in a mirror, but then we will see everything with perfect clarity. All that I know now is partial and incomplete, but then I will know everything completely, just as God now knows me completely.

03 How Do We Reconcile Perceived Discrepancies Between Biblical Passages!

Some Biblical concepts are difficult to understand, because we do not see things the way God sees them.

Some Biblical accounts seem to contradict one another, for the following reasons:

- Different eyewitness accounts focus on different details.
- **Cultural differences** between the Greeks, Romans and Hebrews result in different perspectives.
- The Apostles' **different viewpoints** is reflected in their writings (e.g. Paul and James differed in their teaching on faith and works in relation to salvation).
- **Different interpretations** of the original texts resulted in different translations.
- **Different styles of translation** of the original texts (paraphrase vs literal).
